HVTC Featured Athlete: Art Boyko **By Mark H. Wilson**

Did you have a favorite super hero as a kid? You know; Batman, Superman, Wonder Woman, Isis, the Bionic Woman or the Hulk? What about Aquaman? In case you're unfamiliar with who he was, he could do just about anything in the water including communicating with all aquatic life; oh, yeah, and he could swim REALLY fast!! Well, Art Boyko is our Featured Athlete of the Month and he can do that, too. Okay, maybe he can't actually communicate with fish, but it appears he can swim as fast as them! Let's see how the aqua-ace got started.

Art was born in Albany, NY in 1966 and attended Vincentian Institute (St. Vincent's) for grade school (1st-8th grade) and Bishop Maginn High School in Albany. He went to undergraduate school at SUNY Cortland where he majored in Sociology with a minor in Criminology and Health. Art also obtained a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Marist College in 2003.

Competitive swimming came early to Art; in fact, at the age of four just 1 week before his 5th birthday. However, he had to be bribed by his mother before he would race!! Get this; the organizers would actually stop the meet until Art's mother thought-up a worthwhile incentive before he plunged into the water for a 25 yard sprint. Wonder if the reward was ever any of his present-day junk food favorites; pizza, chicken wings, French fries, good quality cookies and pies! Nope, no way, never, uh-uh, not at all...really!! Art swam throughout his entire childhood and all the way through college. His high school did not have a swim team so he swam with a local club; Albany Starfish. Gotta love swim club names! Art didn't take his swimming seriously though until his junior year in high school and then he really picked-it-up once in college; consequently, he was captain of his university team all four years. Art was an 8-time All-American; he qualified in two events each year specializing in the 100 and 200 yard breaststroke. In addition, he broke school and conference records for both events and recently surrendered the 100 yard record after upholding it for 19 years. Goodness!

Art currently lives in Pleasant Valley, NY with his wife Martha and their three children Emily (12), Abigail (9) and Jason (7); and their dog Quincy (a yellow Labrador retriever). His first experience was the Pawling Triathlon in 2005. He recalls worrying about finishing the race and whether or not he'd actually beat anybody in the 500 person field. Wow, things have definitely changed quickly for Art. He thinks about triathlons a lot, not only when he's working but also during his 89 mile commute from Dutchess County to his office north of Albany every day; ow, that's gotta hurt! Art simply visualizes the next race or a hard training day on the schedule and the time flies by. And despite everybody he knows outside the triathlon world thinking he's crazy for doing these things, the most amusing and innocent question he's asked regarding the Ironman at Lake Placid he completed is "How many days does it take to complete the three events?" Then he searches for a nonchalant way to tell them that he actually RUNS in between each one so as not to waste any time. At that point, it's usually the blank stare and..."How 'bout those Yankees?!" No matter, Art absolutely recommends the sport to others and will continue to promote the sport in the future. When Art has a few free moments, he's on the run again getting his kids to practice/meets, etc. They're active in soccer, swim club and track. But he does enjoy a little down-time cooking, and then of course, eating!! However, eating can make hill-

One week after Eagleman and a week prior to the Tupper Lake Half Ironman, Art was training for Lake Placid near his mother-in-laws in Malone, NY when he was struck by a motorist. He was 1 mile from completing his 60-mile ride, cruising down a hill at 30 mph, when a driver pulls out in front of him; oh, _ _ _ _! (Please provide appropriate expletive!). He attempted to miss the vehicle by swerving, but the car nipped the rear wheel of his new Kestrel. Needless to say, it was a total wipe-out! To top it all, the driver tears-off and leaves our friend to fend for himself?! The police did their best looking for the individual, but no luck. Art was obviously banged-up, got some stitches, had the bike shop do their magic with the Kestrel and all was well soon enough. Welcome to triathlon!

Art's season was rewarding, fun-filled, record-breaking and loong! Art likes triathlon because of the challenges it provides; mastering three individual sports and combining them into one. He feels triathlon mixes aspects such as tenacity, heart, strategy and hard work; that's what gives him a consistent sense of accomplishment, regardless of the race distance.

Due to Art's athleticism, he has had wonderful success in triathlon placing several times in an ever-tougher age-group (M40-44). His goals for the future are to remain healthy, strong and in love with the sport of triathlon. He'd like to qualify again for Clearwater 70.3 in 2007. Art feels fortunate to be involved in such a great sport and expresses his gratitude for the knowledge he gains from each training session or race. As with most super heroes, his work is never done. Thanks, Aquaman!
