HVTC Featured Athlete: John Ferrara

How many people do you know who would begin a new athletic career at the age of 50? How many lawyers do you know who are triathletes? (Okay, there's quite a few in HVTC!) And how many folks do you know who actually have children who introduced the sport of triathlon to THEM? Well, John Ferrara is our Featured Athlete of the Month and he fits all of these categories precisely. He's sacrificed to make triathlon a reality for him and yet he's not about to let go of his favorite vices; anything made from the cocoa bean and grapes. 'Nough said! Let's get to the story.

John was born in Queens, New York and grew up on Long Island. He went to Farmingdale High School which was a football powerhouse at the time. John played some baseball, but mostly basketball and occasionally logging 12 hours per day; there were even days he'd never step into a classroom. ("Nope, no homework today, Mom!") Since he was very resourceful, he got into college at SUNY Stony Brook where he studied and participated in various extra curricular activities as well as getting his BA in a mere five years. John proved that the LSAT (Law School Admission Test) prep courses actually work since he was admitted to American University's Washington College of Law; he graduated in 1983.

On the second weekend, the camp held a kids triathlon; it was hilarious, the race numbers were practically bigger than the kids who weighed-in at about 55 pounds, soaking wet!! Nearly 100 kids lined-up in the lake and swam, jumped, and splashed the 100 meters. John remembers thinking how proud he was that these two little guys, and all of these children, were really pushing themselves; biking up and down hills and running over the sand of a beach to stay fit. He also saw broad smiles light up their faces as each child accomplished their goal of finishing. As he watched, he knew he would really like to do it himself. A long time ago, it was in preparation for basketball season that John discovered his enjoyment/solitude of long distance running. His coach believed that to be successful throughout a long season the kids needed to be in better shape than the competition. (That-a-way, Coach!) So, after about two months of attempting to swim, "At first, I could not get back and forth in a pool!" he enrolled in the September 2005 Sandy Point Triathlon Summer Series. "I was pathetic, but I had a lot of fun."

John has only participated in a few triathlons and he doesn't need anyone around him to convince him he's nuts for doing the sport; he thinks he's plenty nuts himself! Understandably, his wife and kids think it's great he's involved in triathlon and wish him only the best in the endeavor. Of course, now that there are races at Disney World in Florida the kids have extra incentive for keeping dad interested. (That's the spirit, Kids!) Truly, John's kids totally inspire him to do triathlons and he loves it! And joining HVTC has been an incredible vehicle for helping him to stick to his commitment to improve. The sport seemed like fun to him and an efficient way to get physically fit. Bottom-line, he feels a sense of accomplishment that he rarely feels after a hard day at work.

John continues to recommend the sport to others because he'd like to see triathlon attract less competitive athletes. He believes everyone can benefit from better physical

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fitness, and the cross-training that triathlon offers has helped him create the athlete he was as a teenager; okay, plus or minus a few strands of hair. In addition, weight-training has opened-up a whole new world to John thanks to a tri-camp he attended in Clermont, FL.

Being fairly new to triathlon, John has competed in several sprints; HVTC Summer Tri-Series, Highland Triathlon and the Sandy Point Hooker Triathlon. This month, he actually won his first age-group award (3rd M50-54) at the Devilman Triathlon! Wonderful. He would like to complete a ½ Ironman this year and has two on the schedule; Mountaineer Triathlon (WV) and Diamondman (DE). He'll do just fine!

John is proud to be a part of HVTC because it's "filled with people who inspire one another." He remains excited and confident that he'll finish his half Ironman events with a deep sense of gratitude and accomplishment. One question; do they serve red or white wine at the aid stations?
